Rural public libraries are more than a place to check out books, they are a gathering spot where people work on projects, take classes, attend storytimes, build their businesses, learn new skills, and access information. Libraries are essential for supporting healthy, vibrant, informed communities and are an investment in our future generations of thinkers, doers, and leaders.

Yet today, our Stevens County libraries are too small and can't meet modern demands for technology, accessibility, and collaborative meeting spaces. Lack of space and outdated infrastructure are barriers to meeting the needs of our communities. Our local tax dollars are enough to keep the doors open, but not enough to renovate or build new facilities.

Fortuitously, we have an unprecedented opportunity to expand our local libraries and increase access to library resources for every resident. In 2019, the Washington Legislature created the Library Capital Improvement Program (LCIP) to help upgrade library buildings in rural areas. This is the first time the state has ever appropriated funds for public libraries.

The Libraries of Stevens County submitted competitive grant proposals for four projects, totaling \$2 million, to build a new library in Loon Lake and renovate existing libraries in Northport, Chewelah, and Colville. Incredibly, all four grants were awarded, for a total State contribution of \$1 million, with a required dollar for dollar local match of \$1 million.

The planned building improvements will provide meeting rooms, co-working spaces, and current technologies that will create new opportunities to spur economic development, support early literacy, promote lifelong learning, and offer Stevens County residents of all ages access to the information and skills needed to succeed.

Unfortunately, COVID put everything on hold for two years and inflation has increased costs substantially since the initial proposals were submitted in 2020. With the addition of the necessary building accessories that are not covered by the LCIP grants (e.g., HVAC renovations, furniture, shelving, interactive children's materials), the total projected cost is now \$4.7 million.

We're already making progress! Stevens County received a \$1.74 million grant for the new Loon Lake Library, and the Library Foundation received a \$300,000 Congressional appropriation. In addition, the volunteer Friends Groups and the Colville Library Improvement Club have, so far, raised close to \$200,000 and the City of Colville has appropriated \$380,000.

Now we need your help! Though we have made great progress in raising over 70% of the required funds, we still need to raise \$1,000,000 to complete these exciting projects. By providing these additional necessary funds you can be a part of a legacy that will transform our communities. Every dollar is valuable and needed. Together we will create a legacy that benefits everyone in Stevens County for generations to come.



Funding Secured:

- \$48,500 Library Capital Improvement Program Matching funds from the Department of Commerce WA
- \$10,000 American Library Association Accessibility Grant




